My ultimate goal is to see students' learning expand and abilities progress from the time that they have first entered my classroom, challenging those at both the highest and lowest levels. Finally, I must always keep in mind that education is an ongoing learning process where students learn from teachers, students learn from each other, and teachers learn from students.
